Croatian Integrated Maritime Information System – CIMIS (National Ship Reporting System)

Notice No.2

Dear ship operators, masters and crew members,

As informed by CIMIS Notice No.1 the Republic of Croatia has developed and implemented the National electronic ship reporting system named Croatian Integrated Maritime Information System (CIMIS).

Electronic exchange of information through CIMIS is normally done through the authorized ship agents using the web user interface and structured .xls forms (NOA/D, Crew, Passenger, Cargo, HAZMAT, Waste, ISPS, PSC MEI and Ballast) designed to make it easier for shipping to meet ship reporting demands.

Maritime Safety Directorate of this Ministry is responsible for administering and developing CIMIS and collaborates with other governmental agencies to further develop and improve CIMIS as a **maritime single window** for ship reporting to ports and governmental agencies within the maritime sector (Harbour Master's Offices, Customs, Border control and Sanitary inspection).

CIMIS enables shipping to send information to governmental agencies only once through a single window, instead of having to send a number of reports to different agencies by email, telephone, fax or post.

The development of CIMIS is an living process based on national and European union requirements namely Directive 2002/59/EC as amended and Directive 2010/65/EU.

By the end of the year 2015 CIMIS will be upgraded to support electronic exchange of Maritime Declaration of Health data, Ship's stores data, Crew's effects data, Itinerary of cruise ship, Bunker data and detailed HAZMAT classification.

This will enable ships to even more efficiently report mandatory information to ports and governmental authorities electronically, making it easier to send necessary information and reducing reporting requirements towards shipping to a minimum.

We wish you Calm seas and pleasant stay in Croatia.
